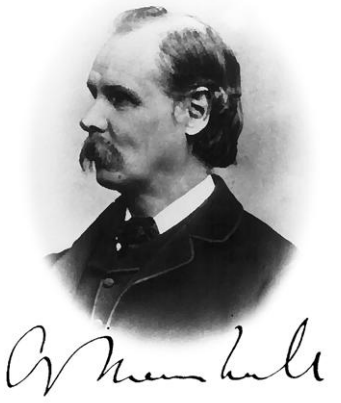

Content**Summary**

These two slim volumes of papers read to the Cambridge Economic Club were originally catalogued within the Marshall Papers. No written record remains as to the circumstances of their deposit in the Marshall Library, but the first bears the name of John Ellis McTaggart of Trinity College and the list of contents of the second was written by Joseph Robson Tanner of St John's, the first known President of the Club. They provide the only known evidence that the 'Economic Society' was meeting as early as May 1884. The latest paper in these volumes is from 1890, after which it may have ceased to function. In a letter to Taussig of 14 October 1896 [Taussig papers at Harvard], Alfred Marshall mentions being President of a new student Economic Club at Cambridge, to which his opening address was 'The Old Generation of Economists and the New'.

Summary	Collected volume of printed copies of papers read to the Club. First page lists 3 points submitted for investigation to the 'Economic Society'; possible evils resulting from employment of married women, health and life expectancy of factory workers, women's wages.
