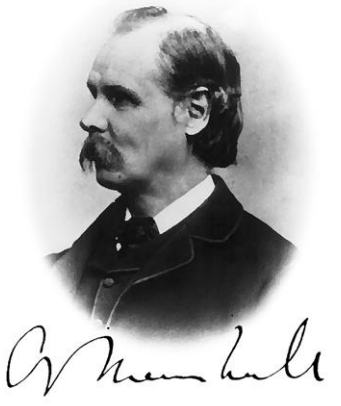

Reports show what demands of mob government on a central institution may be, one of his reasons for opposing centralized note issue. Bank of France was never repaid what Commune extorted, and might have been far more pillaged. Glad if Keynes would show reports to [Alfred] Marshall and any other Cambridge friends with views on note issues.

Summary

The papers in this section were deposited by Sir Geoffrey Keynes in 1958, and relate to what became known as the "Pigou Case". This was the University of Cambridge's application for exemption from the provisions of the Military Service Act for Professor Arthur Cecil Pigou, on the grounds of his being indispensable to Economics teaching. The most vociferous opponents of Pigou within the University were William Cunningham and Roderick Henry Macleod. John Neville Keynes represented Pigou on behalf of the Board of Economics at both the first Borough Tribunal on 10 May 1916, when Pigou secured conditional exemption, and at the appeal against this decision brought about by the military representative and held on 22 May. The appeal of the Military was dismissed, but Herbert Somerton Foxwell was mentioned as a possible substitute for Pigou, being above the age for military service. Differing versions of the private discussions between Keynes and Foxwell about this became public, leading to claims by both parties that they had been misrepresented at the 22 May hearing. Thus at the behest of the military representative, a special sitting of the Local Tribunal was set for 21 June 1916, when Pigou was represented by John Harold Clapham. Again he secured a conditional exemption.
