Books & ebooks

The Marshall Library provides access to thousands of books and ebooks supporting taught courses in both Economics and development Studies.

Students on taught courses can borrow up to 10 books while PhDs can borrow 20. These limits are flexible so you can easily borrow additional books if you need them.

All books renew automatically for as long as you want them and there are no fines.

‘Click & Collect’

All Marshall Library books are available using the Click & Collect option in the iDiscover catalogue. **What does this mean?** The books you request via Click & Collect will be retrieved from the shelves by library staff, issued to your account and will be waiting for you to collect from the Issue Desk. You can, of course, still borrow books directly from the shelves.
