The 47 letters comprising Fay section 1 were deposited in the Marshall Library by Charles Ryle Fay in April 1938, his covering letter to Sraffa clearly stating that they were in return for a volume of Hume's work, which had presumably been given to Fay by Sraffa.

They were originally catalogued within the library's miscellaneous letters collection, but have now been separated and re-numbered in alphabetical sequence by writer. Fay selected these items for presentation as being from famous economists of his youth. How many other letters he destroyed and at what date is unknown. It appears that no other substantial collection of his papers remains.

Many of the letters are short and the subject matter often the

purely practical arrangements of economics examiners and lectures at Cambridge. However, even these can shed light on the differing factions within the department. A considerable number concern suggested reading matter when Fay was a research scholar at the London School of Economics. The ten letters from Alfred Marshall are the longest series. These reveal his involvement with Fay's research on European co-operation and also Fay's assistance with the 6th edition of Marshall's 'Principles'. Five were thought of sufficient interest to be published in John K. Whitaker's edition of Marshall's correspondence.

The collection of 20 maps forming Fay section 2 was presented by Fay in 1944, according to a hand-written label found with them. They were presumably used as visual aids in his undergraduate lectures. In the absence of a complete numbering sequence they have been listed in date order within sections for Great Britain, Canada (maps of specific areas last) and the World.

The single postcard in section 3, from Fay to Professor John

Habbakuk, was added to the collection in 1998.

BIOGRAPHY Charles Ryle Fay was born on 13 Jan 1884, the oldest son of Charles and Emily Fay. He attended the Merchant Taylors' School, Crosby, Lancashire before gaining a place at King's College, Cambridge to read History. He gained Firsts in Parts I and II 1904-5. He was a student of Alfred Marshall's and an undergraduate contemporary of Maynard Keynes at King's.

Fay was subsequently elected to the Shaw Studentship, a research scholarship at the London School of Economics. This was provided by Mrs George Bernard Shaw (nee Charlotte Payne Townsend) and was worth £100 a year for two years. He was also granted £60 from the Worts Fund of Cambridge University in June 1906 towards his travel expenses, on condition he reported the results of his investigations in a form that might be published by the Senate. His research topic was the Co-operative movement in Europe. culminating in the publication in 1908 of his book 'Co-operation at Home and Abroad'. While still a research student he began to lecture for the Cambridge Economics Tripos, and was elected a Fellow of Christ's College in 1908. With an interruption for military service in The Buffs and Machine Gun Corps from 1915-18, Fay remained active in teaching economic history in Cambridge until 1921, when he was appointed Professor of Economic History at Toronto University, Canada. In 1931 he returned to Cambridge as Reader in Economic History, a position he held until retirement

Fay's teaching centred on English Economic History, particularly of the nineteenth century. However, in 1937, for example, he taught a course on the Economic Development of the British East Indies from 1869-1929. He was a prolific author, his books including "Life and Labour in the 19th century" and "Great Britain from Adam Smith to the Present Day".

Fay married Alice Quendryth Hartland and had three sons. After his retirement he lived in Belfast, where he died 19 Nov 1961.
