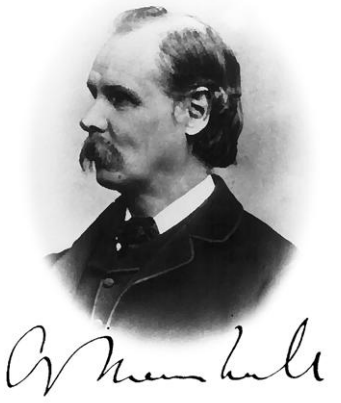

Content**Summary**

A small collection of items relating to John Hilton, Professor of Industrial Relation at Cambridge University from 1931 to his death in 1943. The two scrapbooks of cuttings of his articles from the "News Chronicle" were probably compiled by Miss S.R. Senior, who presented them to the Marshall Library in 1986.

Summary

The family papers were sent to him in 1943 by Alice Hilton for deposit in the Marshall Library. They have been arranged alphabetically by the surname of the particular branch of the family to which they relate, with miscellaneous items at the end. Some family details are given in the covering letter, now Hilton 2.
