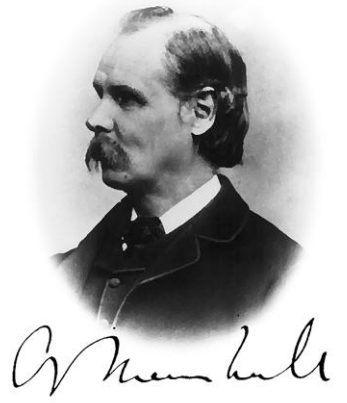

Papers concerning creation of Economics Tripos
This section comprises papers concerning Marshall's involvement in the creation of a separate Economics Tripos at Cambridge University in 1903. Most of the material is printed pamphlets or newspaper cuttings. It was deposited by Florence Keynes in 1950 and is probably material kept by her husband, John Neville Keynes.

Summary	Annotated typescript Marshall's open letter (1 Oct 1902) to members of Cambridge University Economics Syndicate quoting letters from businessmen in support of establishment of Faculty of Economics, copy he sent to John Neville Keynes and another with no addressee.
Summary	Various printed pamphlets: list Cambridge lectures in Moral Science 1887-8 with Marshall's annotations on section for syllabus of his lectures, proof copy Marshall's 'A Plea for the Creation of a Curriculum in Economics...' with minor annotation and copy as printed (April 1902), copy 'Economic Teaching at the Universities in relation to Public Well-Being' [originally read at conference of Members of the Committee on Social Education, 24 Oct 1902].
Summary	2 pp. Marshall's hand-written arguments for instituting Economics Tripos at Cambridge and what it should contain.
Summary	15 printed resolutions and memoranda to Economics Syndicate and University Senate concerning proposed Economics Tripos (arranged in date order where possible): list of 16 resolutions agreed by syndicate up to 12 Nov 1902, G E Green and W F Reddaway against new Tripos, J W Headlam against (annotated by Marshall), William Cunningham and James Ellis McTaggart against, Cunningham's draft resolutions, memo from Cunningham and McTaggart almost identical with first, Marshall's printed version of extracts from letters of support, further statement by Cunningham, J R Tanner and Stanley Leathes in support, Herbert Somerton Foxwell in support, McTaggart's reply to Foxwell, H M Gwatkin in support of Historical Tripos (annotated by Marshall), F W Maitland in support of separating History and Economics, also Geoffrey Lowes Dickinson, Marshall's fly-sheet of 5 June, the day before the vote.
Summary	Marshall's note of Cunningham's view that an 'Economic Tripos not only is unnecessary, but would be positively injurious to Cambridge economic study'. Draft petition from Economics Board to Council of Trinity College that Cunningham's position as Director of Economics in Trinity College is prejudicial to new Tripos. Chamber of Commerce Journal review of Marshall's 'The New Cambridge Curriculum in Economics'. 1921 report of Special Board for Economics and Politics on Regulations for the Economics Tripos from Cambridge Reporter.

Summary	Pamphlet addressed to members of the Senate giving Marshall's reasons against opening the Cambridge B.A. to women.
Summary	Believes if the scheme for an Imperial University for Women fails that women should be granted external or associate degrees at Cambridge. But believes that Bishop of Stepney's scheme for women's university is best solution. Outlines improvements in women's higher education since about 1870 and Cambridge's part in this. Does not want University to make a decision which is not in its long-term interests.
Summary	Claims that domestic ties of women prevent them from devoting 3 or 4 years to study. This was case when he was in Bristol, where most women devoted about half their time to study and half to domestic responsibility. Admits women can perform very strongly in Cambridge exams, but thereafter their 'constructive work' falls short of men. Cites American experience where co-educational universities in west have not spread to east. Numbers of women should be limited in Cambridge, similar to present level and special committee should report to Council of University on women's education.
