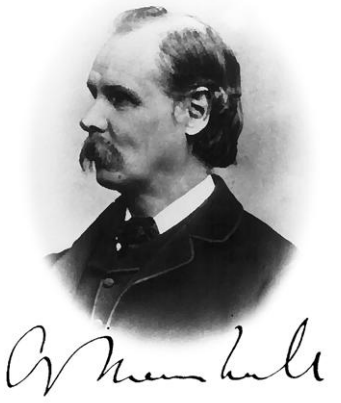

Clapham's 4 page study of U.K. wool and cotton trade for the same period has been put in the same folder [at the end]. Pigou's work annotated with author's name on title page and note on page 1 by Austin Robinson [see Pigou 1/8]
