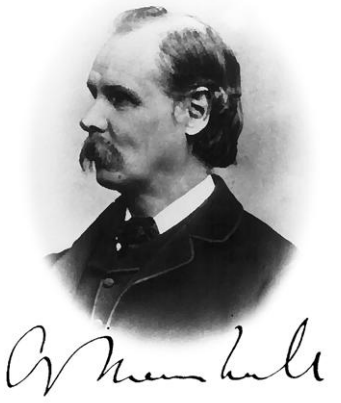

**Summary**

This collection was deposited in the Marshall Library by Judith Allen in January 1990. It comprises files generated by Professor Thomas K. Rymes' project to collect and transcribe notes taken by students attending J.M. Keynes's Cambridge lectures in the early 1930's. The final result of the project was the book "Keynes's Lectures, 1932-35: notes of a representative student: a synthesis of lecture notes taken by students at Keynes's lectures in the 1930s leading up to the publication of *The General Theory*" (1989) by Rymes. This was published under the aegis of the Royal Economic Society, whilst publication of the Complete Works of Keynes was still in progress. The acknowledgements section in the book outlines the history of Rymes' involvement. Rymes also completed a complete edited transcript of the notes he used, a copy of which is in the Keynes papers at King's College, Cambridge. Professor Austin Robinson actively collaborated with Rymes by acquiring for the Marshall Library as many sets of students' notes as possible. These notes, either originals or copies, are within the Rymes papers, as is correspondence concerning their deposit.
