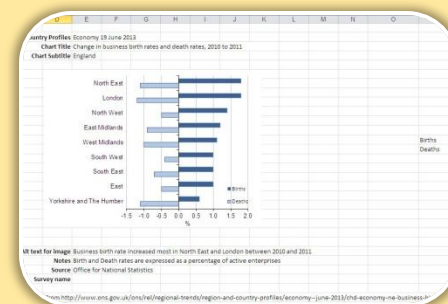

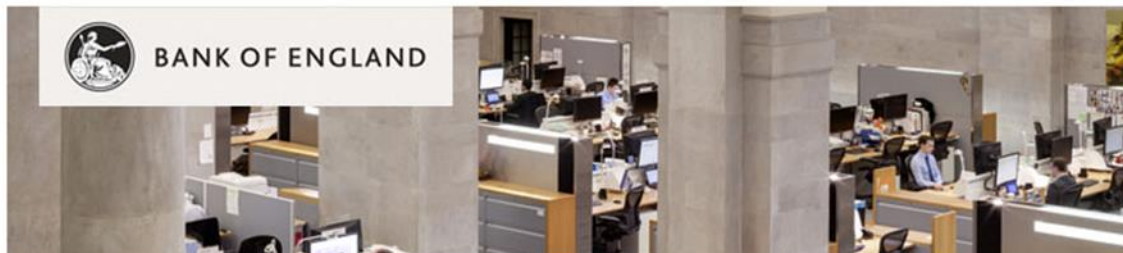

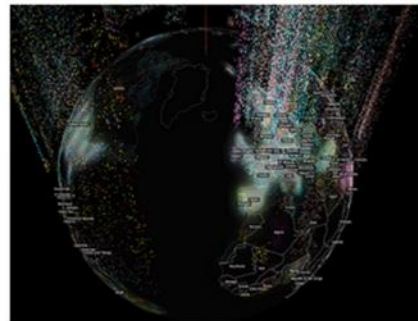

## CPI for all items falls 0.2% as gasoline prices drop; shelter, apparel, food indexes rise

On a seasonally adjusted basis, the Consumer Price Index for All Urban Consumers declined 0.2 percent in February after being unchanged in January. The index for all items less food and energy rose 0.3 percent in February, the same increase as in January.

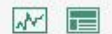

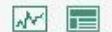



### A collection of British Historical Population Reports

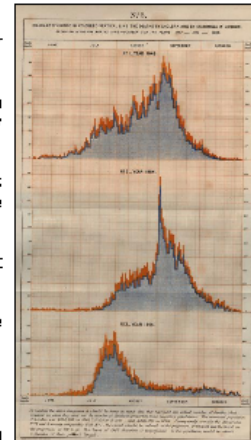
The Online Historical Population Reports (OHPR) collection provides online access to the complete British population reports for Britain and Ireland from 1801 to 1937.

The collection goes far beyond the basic population reports with a wealth of textual and statistical material which provide an in-depth view of the economy, society (through births, deaths and marriages) and medicine during the nineteenth and early twentieth centuries.

These 200,000 pages of census and registration material for the British Isles are supported by numerous ancillary documents from The National Archives, critical essays and transcriptions of important legislation which provide an aid to understanding the context, content and creation of the collection.

In digitising this resource the OHPR has enabled Browsing through the collection by date or geography, or Searching the content directly. Documents relating to the digitization and web development process may be accessed via the Project tab.

OHPR is an AHDS History project, funded as part of the JISC Digitisation programme and is hosted by the UK Data Archive at the University of Essex.

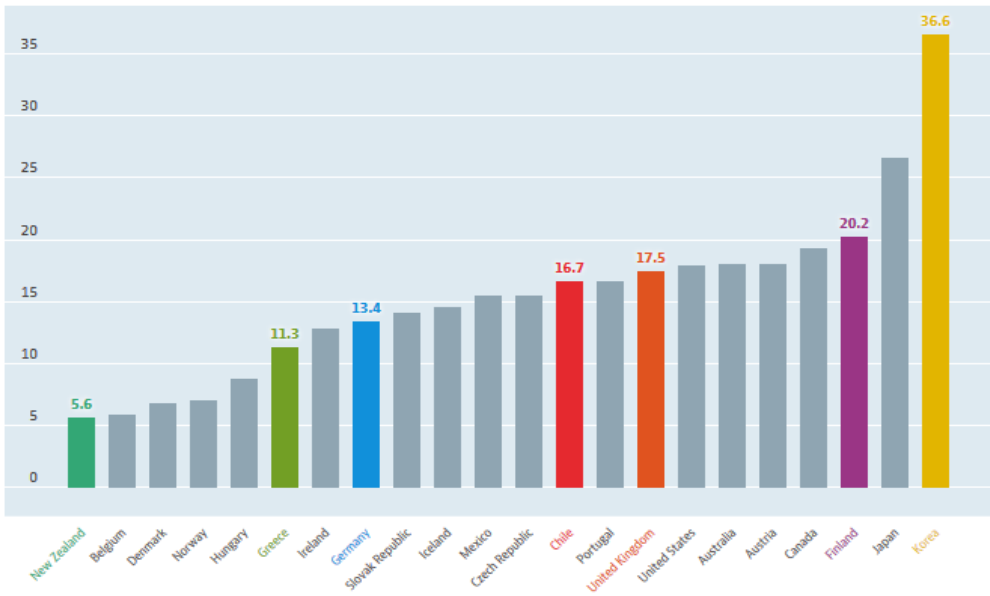

### About the History Data Service Collection

The History Data Service data collection brings together over 650 separate studies transcribed, scanned or compiled from historical sources. The studies cover a wide range of historical topics, from the seventh century to the twentieth century. Although the primary focus of the collection is on the United Kingdom, it also includes a significant body of cross-national and international data collections. Examples of topics covered include: nineteenth and twentieth century statistics, manuscript census records, state finance data, demographic data, mortality data, community histories, electoral history and economic indicators.

##### [Contemporary and Historical Census Collection](#)

The Contemporary and Historical Census Collection (CHCC) improves access to individual-level demographic data from the manuscript census enumerator's books and two major collections of aggregate-level demographic data - the Great Britain Historical Database and the Database of Welsh Historical Statistics. CHCC allows users to order online subsets from the transcribed census enumerators' books of the 1881 census for England and Wales. CHCC also allows users to order specific tables from the Great Britain Historical Database and the Database of Welsh Historical Statistics. Currently access to CHCC is *only* available to members of the UK higher and further education community conducting not-for-profit research and/or teaching and learning.

##### [Census Enumerators' books](#)

In addition to CHCC the History Data Service holds an ever growing collection of transcriptions from nineteenth century census enumerators' books. These mainly cover particular geographic areas and for some areas cover two or more censuses.

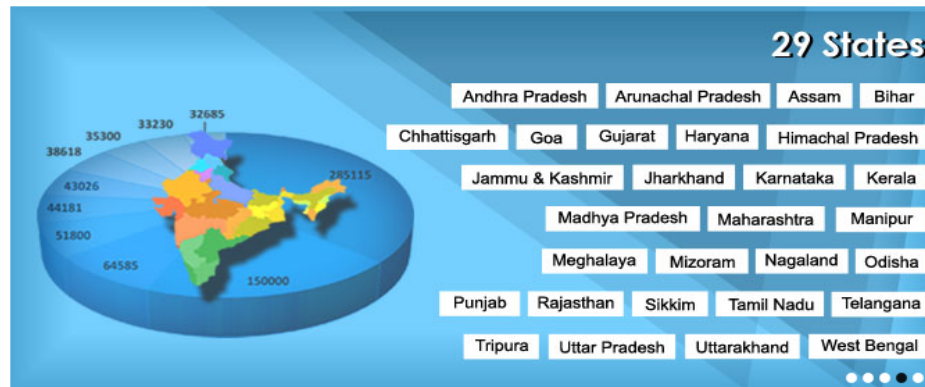

The Patent Database covers data on patent applications to the [European Patent Office \(EPO\)](#), the [US Patent and Trademark Office \(USPTO\)](#), patent applications filed under the [Patent Co-operation Treaty \(PCT\)](#) that designate the EPO, as well as [Triadic patent families](#). Data mainly derives from the latest version of the EPO's [Worldwide Patent Statistical Database \(PATSTAT\)](#).

The patent indicators presented in this compendium are specifically designed to reflect recent trends in inventive activities across a wide range of OECD member and non-member countries. 


